HOW TO USE:

DO NOT use Winter Grass Killer on heavy red and peat soils.
DO NOT mix with any other pesticides

SITUATION	PEST	RATE	HOW TO APPLY
Turf & Lawns Common Couch	Winter Grass	All States 60g in 10L water per 100m ² lawn	Apply during the Autumn and Winter, if established turf is infested with seedling Winter Grass. Ensure a uniform coverage. Irrigate immediately after application with 12-25mm irrigation or rain and again 24 hours later. Repeat treatment if necessary on Qld blue couch after 4 weeks. DO NOT RESEED FOR 60 DAYS AFTER TREATMENT. Use ONLY on established turf. DO NOT use on bluegrass, ryegrass, fescue or bent grass lawns
Buffalo Grass		WA only 60g in 10L water per 100m ² lawn	

NOT TO BE USED FOR ANY PURPOSE OR IN ANY MANNER, CONTRARY TO THIS LABEL UNLESS AUTHORISED.

HOW TO PREPARE:

Enclosed spoon holds 2 grams when heaped. Add half of the water to the spray tank, mix in the recommended amount of Winter Grass Killer then add the rest of the water and agitate. The mixture must be kept in suspension at all times by continuous agitation.

CAUTION:

DO NOT allow spray to contact or drift onto plants you do not want killed.
DO NOT allow chemical containers or spray to get into drains, sewers, streams or ponds.
DO NOT feed turf/lawn clippings to poultry or livestock.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:

Store in the closed original container in a cool, dry place out of reach of children. Do not store in direct sunlight. Dispose of empty container by wrapping in paper, placing in plastic bag and putting in garbage.

SAFETY DIRECTIONS:

Will irritate the eyes and skin. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Avoid inhaling the dust. When preparing the spray, or using the prepared spray, wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist, washable hat and elbow length PVC gloves. After use, wash hands, arms and face thoroughly with soap and water. After each days use, wash gloves and contaminated clothing.
